SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - ALL GOD'S FAMILY!

My husband wondered what I was up to because he heard me laughing in my office. He rolled his eyes when I told him that Luke's gospel had elicited my giggles. When I explained, my husband reminded me, "You weren't laughing back then!" No, I wasn't.

It was thirty-five years ago. Our twelve-year-old had walked down the block to his friend's house. They'd planned to spend the evening exploring a new video game. A few hours later, when he failed to return home on time, I called that neighbor to ask her to send our son home. She responded that he wasn't there. When my neighbor asked her husband if our son had come by, he said he hadn't seen him. This was completely out of character. Our son was always good about sharing his whereabouts and checking in with us. After calling the parents of a few of his other friends with no results, I was frantic. Things could happen to kids in a split second, and I knew our son wasn't immune.

With that, my husband decided to look for him. I stayed home with our younger son hoping for news. Though Tim was only four years old, he sensed trouble easily, and he reacted with inconsolable fear. Tim was worried about his big brother. Just as my husband headed out the door to begin his search, I called our neighbor again to ask that she let us know if our son appeared there. After commiserating with me, she hung up the phone and went to check on her own sons who'd been playing in the basement. When she headed down the stairs, our son bolted up. Mike Jr. confessed that he'd lost track of the time. When he realized how late it was, he decided to run home. By the time my neighbor called to apologize for inadvertently inspiring our worst fears, my outof-breath son walked through the door to a most unexpected hug!

Though I laughed as I read today's gospel (Luke 2:41-52), my husband was absolutely correct.



I didn't laugh when I experienced what Mary and Joseph had. Luke wrote that Jesus and his parents had walked from Nazareth to Jerusalem to observe the Feast of Passover. They'd traveled in the company of

numerous neighbors and friends. In those days, the men and women often walked in separate groups. The younger children stayed near their moms, while the older ones drifted toward their dads or their own friends. When the group arrived in Jerusalem, they all celebrated Passover in the temple there. All the while, Mary and Joseph seem to have allowed Jesus to mingle freely amidst the caravan. After all, Jesus was almost a teenager.

All seemed to have gone well until they began the trek home. It was nightfall when Mary and Joseph realized that Jesus wasn't with the group. Though Luke wrote that they made this discovery three days into their walk, I think Luke used a bit of literary license here. Scripture scholars tell us this might have been Luke's attempt to relate Jesus being lost for three days to his being in the tomb for three days after his death. As for me, I can't imagine any parent remaining calm after three days of not seeing his or her child!

Left to travel alone, Mary and Joseph hurried back to Jerusalem to search for Jesus. When they finally found him in the temple, Jesus seemed bothered by their worry. He asked, "Why were you

looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" I know many of us could have advised Mary and Joseph regarding how to respond to their seemingly overconfident son! However, Mary and Joseph had taught Jesus compassion,



patience and forgiveness. They seem to have chosen to practice what they'd preached that day. As for Jesus, he returned to Nazareth "...and was obedient to them." As for my elder son, I'm quite certain that he's proud of the fact that, in a similar situation, he pleased his parents far more successfully than Jesus had pleased Mary and Joseph that day!

We all have reason to celebrate today's Feast of the Holy Family. Being human is so important that God sent Jesus, not to "act" as one of us, but to truly "be" one of us. This explains Jesus' inability to understand his parents' worry. Twelve-year-old that he was, Jesus simply did what he knew he had to do. This also explains Jesus' persistence in revealing God's love for us. Just as Jesus' parents searched until they found him, Jesus kept and keeps track of us. Whether we are twelve months, twelve years, twenty, thirty-five, sixty-four or eighty-seven, God asks only that we do the same: That we care for those we've been given to love as only we can!

GOSPEL MEDITATION



As a first-time pastor in a parish, I received a phone call one afternoon from a young married couple, "Father, our 2-year-old son drowned in our pool this morning. We are at the hospital. Please help us." I sped over. The little boy was gone, his body cold, slightly blue, laid out on a bed. His parents were distraught and in shock. For the next few years, I walked with the couple along their difficult and painful road. They openly shared with me how they were often tempted to blame and accuse each other for the loss. And yet, by God's grace, their love for each grew stronger and deeper as the years went by.

The Holy Family was not without its pain and loss, either. Luke tells us, after losing their twelve-year-old son, Joseph and Mary "after three days found him in the temple area, sitting among the teachers..." (Luke 2:46). We don't know specifically what those three days were like for them except for what Mary says: "Your father and I have been looking for you anxiously." The three days of his absence foreshadow his death and burial. His finding in the temple is a kind of resurrection for his family. They had to learn, again and again, that their family was becoming a place where death and resurrection was not only accepted but welcomed and celebrated. But surely they deeply felt the dangerous agony of their loss — just like every couple who has lost a child.

What losses in your experience of family still cause you anxiety? In what ways has God's presence seemingly vanished in your family? Will you keep searching for Jesus? Remember, he will rise and be found. Your family may be suffering, but when he is found, it will be stronger than ever before.

"Son, why have you done this to us?


Your father and I have been looking for you with great



The next class is January 2, 2025 at 7pm in the Church.




KNIGHTS CORNER

Please use machine wash & dry acrylic yarn in 'worsted' weight (often designated as size 4 on the skein's label) in colors that bring you joy as you work with it.

Rectangular shawls should be 60" long by 20-24" high; triangular shawls should be 60" long by 28" high. Lap blanket size is recommended 40" X 40".

If you would like to learn how to knit or crochet, we have supplies to get you started. It is helpful to know a new learner will be joining us in the event a special technique lesson has been planned for a particular month or if a meeting would be canceled due to inclement weather. MARY, MOTHER OF GOD





Jesus' Grandparents

Question: July 26 is the feast of Joachim and Anna. Who are they and what do we know about them?

Answer: Joachim and Anna are the parents of Mary, the mother of Jesus, yet there is absolutely no biblical reference to them whatsoever. So where do we get their names, and what is their story?

Their names are found in an apocryphal (hidden) gospel known as "The Infancy Gospel of James." Apocryphal, or hidden gospels, consist of accounts of Jesus' life that were ultimately not accepted as inspired works, and thus were not included in the Bible. However, they sometimes captured the Christian imagination, spilling into the devotional dimension of the community.

James' infancy gospel begins with the parents of Mary and their desire for a child. In their prayer and petitions to God, they are heard and given the blessings of a child, whom they named Mary. While we have no idea who Mary's parents really were, the fact that we celebrate the feast of Joachim and Anna indicates that the bond of family love is important in the Christian life.

Long before Grandparents' Day was established, the church had a feast that honored the presumed grandparents of Jesus. While their names are part of non-inspired apocryphal legends, the fact of the Savior's human ancestry is not. Christ, the incarnate Word, dwelt among us in the flesh in a human family. In honoring the grandparents of Jesus we really proclaim our faith in the Incarnation--God becoming human!

ST. GIANNA BERETTA MOLLA



St. Gianna Beretta Molla (1922-1962) was born in northern Italy, near Milan. Her parents were both Third Order Franciscans and she was the tenth of 13 children. At just 12 years old Gianna became a member of Catholic Action, a movement which advocated for a more intense spiritual life for Catholic laity. She would continue as a member and leader of the movement her whole life.

In 1942, both of Gianna's parents died, only four months apart. Despite the loss, she continued to be active joining the St. Vincent de Paul Society, serving the elderly and sick. In 1949 Gianna completed her degrees in Medicine and Surgery from the University of Pavia. She opened her own medical office in 1950. Two years later she earned a specialty in pediatrics. While medicine was her calling, she also enjoyed skiing and mountaineering, the theater, the opera, and concerts.

She and Pietro Molla fell in love and were married in September 1955, fulfilling Gianna's vocation. Their first child, Pierluigi, was born the next year. By 1959 they had been blessed with two more children, Maria Zita, and Laura. Gianna was pregnant with her fourth child in 1961 when unusual pains revealed a uterine tumor. She elected to have a surgical procedure to remove the tumor but continued the pregnancy. This was incredibly risky for her at the time, but she insisted that whatever happened to her, the child should be saved. Gianna carried the baby to term, and Gianna Emanuela was born by C-section in April 1962. One week later the saint succumbed to septic peritonitis, giving her life for her daughter's.

Gianna is the first woman doctor and working mom to be canonized. She was beatified by Pope John Paul II on April 24, 1994, and officially canonized on May 16, 2004. St. Gianna Beretta Molla, pray for us! Prayer- For Everybody and Everyday
