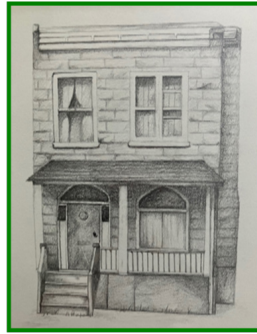

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT - GOD LISTENS... GOD HEALS... GOD LOVES...

It's difficult for me to imagine an angry God. From the time I was a very young child, I was taught to turn to God in both the best and worst of times. The lessons I received in this regard began with my parents. I've shared before that I lived the first dozen years of my life in a second floor flat on Polk Street, the Westside, Chicago. The space we called "home" was crowded with family and with love. My parents rented that flat from Uncle Gee at an extremely economical rate because he and my grandfather occupied one of our three bedrooms. We were literally one big happy family!



It was in the flat that my parents' lessons regarding God's love for us became a tangible and appreciated commodity. When Grandpa's rheumatoid arthritis and diabetes seemed to be getting the best of him, my mom urged us all to pray. We gathered in our living room every evening to ask God's help. We felt that God had heard us because Grandpa enjoyed many good days and occasional bursts of energy. When his final illness came, we prayed again. This time, we prayed for his happy death. In the end, we knew God had heard us once again because Grandpa was finally happy at home in heaven.

A few years later, my parents gathered us all in the living room to pray again. This time, we asked God's help for Uncle Gee. My uncle had developed pneumonia and was having difficulty fighting it. Once again, our prayerful requests changed from "healing" to "a happy death". When my uncle passed, I knew God had answered us once again because my parents assured me that, like Grandpa, Uncle Gee was happy and healthy in heaven. What an amazing gift my parents had given me! They were so convinced of God's loving intervention in everything! How could I not share their faith in God's nurturing love?

When I consider my own children at the ages when I experienced these losses, I wonder how I could possibly have explained the equivalent circumstances to them. The truth is that my husband and I did. My husband's dad passed when our older son was only five years old. Mike's dad was a wonderful grandpa whom our son loved to spend time with. This was a tough loss for a little boy.

Yet, somehow, we and he got through it with those wonderful memories intact. Perhaps the image of Grandpa happy and healthy in heaven was enough to counter our sadness.

Today, Mark's gospel (Mark 5:21-43) places Jesus in the midst of a pressing crowd where he will encounter similar circumstances. Somehow, despite the circus around him, Jesus draws people close to himself. Jesus' loving and perceptive awareness of each one urges them nearer to hear more. On this occasion, Jairus, a synagogue official, makes his way through the throng. Jairus is desperate, and he seems not to care who hears his plea. Before he says a word, Jairus kneels at Jesus' feet. The man's young daughter is dying, and Jairus is convinced that Jesus can help her. Now Jairus' request is truly remarkable because the religious leaders of Jesus' day constantly questioned Jesus' behavior and his authority. They had no use for him! Still, despite their doubt, Jesus' work touches Jairus' heart, and this is enough for him.

Now, as Jesus and the crowd move toward Jairus' home, a woman who has been hemorrhaging for more than a decade pushes her way toward Jesus. Jesus' loving ways filled her with such hope that she wishes only to touch his cloak. She is certain that this touch will be enough to heal her. Amazingly, that boisterous crowd fails to distract Jesus from this woman. As soon as she touches his garment, Jesus feels her presence. At that very moment, the woman is healed. Now while Jesus continues on to Jairus' home, he's told that the girl has died. Nonetheless, Jesus reassures Jairus. When goes to the dying child's bedside, Jesus says, "Little girl, I say to you arise!" And she does!



It occurs to me that the most important lesson we can take from Jairus' and the hemorrhaging woman's encounters with Jesus is that God always listens when we pray. Though God's response may differ from what we hope for, that response is always in the best interest of all concerned. I guess I can't help holding onto my parents' certainty about all of this because, even when a cure doesn't come and a loved one's loss isn't prevented, the outcome for them is just right. We who remain are consoled by God's absolute love for us all.

GOSPEL MEDITATION



Sin isn't given its due these days. Downplaying sin is dangerous. But there is also another spiritual misstep in which we make way too big a deal out of sin. It happens, for example, when we persistently wonder if our confessed sins are "really" forgiven, or suspiciously ponder what God "really" thinks about us, behind His merciful face. Or when someone returns to Church, and we question whether his or her conversion was genuine. Or when we commit some sin and put on a sad face for days, thinking, "Maybe my sins are too great for God to deal with." God save us from that attitude!

Well, he does just that, this week, in the raising of Jairus' daughter. The dead twelve-year-old's house is filled with a spirit of excessive moaning and groaning, tumultuous weeping and wailing. They even laugh at Jesus in a mocking tone. It's shocking how *easy* it is for him to raise the dead child. It is equivalent to gently waking a kid from a light nap. And then he sends her off to get some lunch. No big whoop. The overactive drama is actually part of the problem, and removing it is a key part of the miracle.

Friends, sin can and does kill, but Jesus is *always* ready and able to raise us back to life, often without much hullabaloo. His ease of forgiving should never be a pretext for presumption, minimizing sin, or taking lightly the cost he pays for our sins on the cross. But for God's sake, we often need Jesus to put out the weepers and wailers. He's the Lord. And remember, the girl is not dead, she's just sleeping.

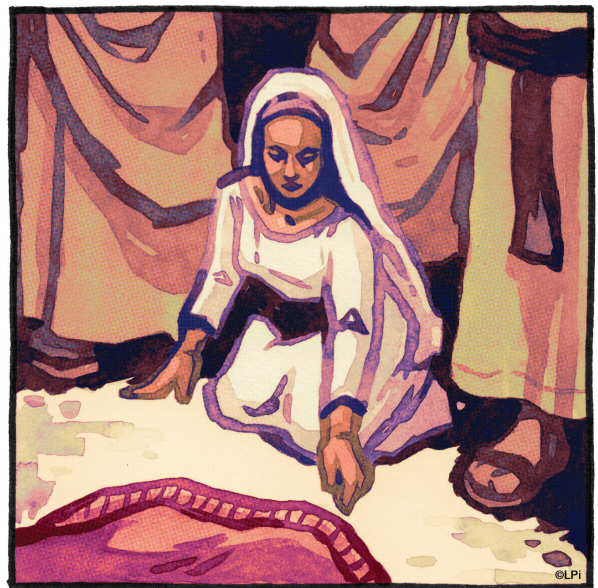

GOSPEL

MK 5:21-24, 35B-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat
to the other side, a large crowd gathered around him,
and he stayed close to the sea. One of the synagogue
officials, named Jairus, came forward. Seeing him he fell
at his feet and pleaded earnestly with him, saying, "My
daughter is at the point of death. Please, come lay your
hands on her that she may get well and live." He went off
with him, and a large crowd followed him and pressed
upon him.

While he was still speaking, people from the synagogue
official's house arrived and said, "Your daughter has died;
why trouble the teacher any longer?" Disregarding the
message that was reported, Jesus said to the synagogue
official, "Do not be afraid; just have faith."
He did not allow anyone to accompany him inside
except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James.
When they arrived at the house of the synagogue official,
he caught sight of a commotion, people weeping and
wailing loudly. So he went in and said to them, "Why
this commotion and weeping? The child is not dead but
asleep." And they ridiculed him. Then he put them all
out. He took along the child's father and mother and
those who were with him and entered the room where
the child was. He took the child by the hand and said to
her, "Talitha koum," which means, "Little girl, I say to
you, arise!" The girl, a child of twelve, arose immediately
and walked around. At that they were utterly astounded.
He gave strict orders that no one should know this and
said that she should be given something to eat.

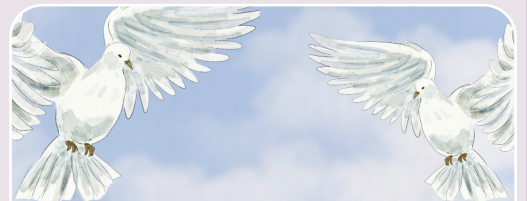

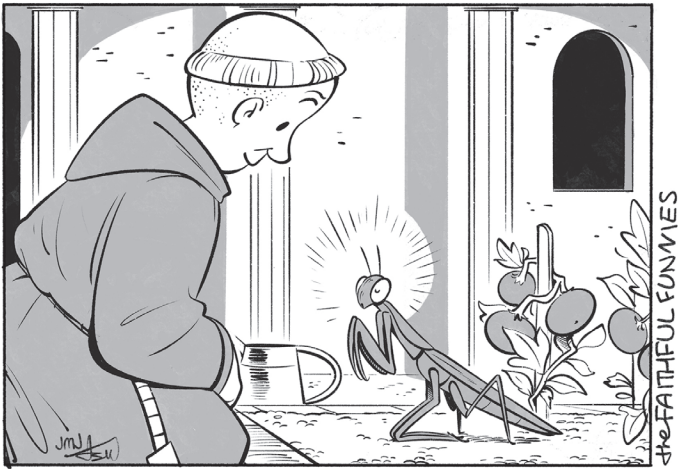

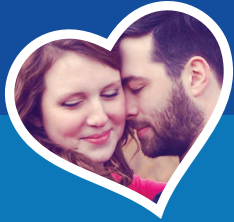
