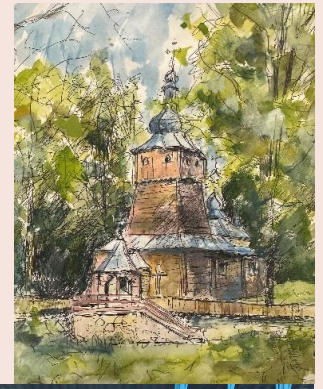

Dear SPA Family,

I would like to introduce you to the missionary for Mission Co-Op Sunday (May 25/26). **Fr. Maciej (Matthias) Fleszar** was my classmate at a seminary in Poland. We studied together in my home diocese for four years. Father Maciej, aged 45, after graduating from the High School of Fine Arts, he entered the Higher Seminary in Tarnów. The painting here depicting the church in my town, was painted by him during a break between classes in the seminary. Following his ordination, he served as a vicar among the Cracovian community in Zaborów and among the Highlanders in Ochotnica Dolna.



Influenced by reading the Pope Francis's apostolic exhortation "*The Joy of the Gospel*" and visiting the empty tomb of Jesus in Jerusalem, he asked his bishop to send him to an underdeveloped part of the world. After two years of language and cultural preparation in Poland and France, he was sent to the **Republic of Congo**, where he was entrusted with building the parish of St. John Paul II in the capital city of Brazzaville. This parish is located in one of the neglected districts of the city without access to water and electricity. The construction plan for this parish, which has about five thousand faithful parishioners, includes not only the parish church itself but also a vocational school and a medical clinic which was designed by himself.



Thanks to the involvement of the local community and the assistance provided to Father Maciej by his compatriots from Poland and the USA, the school building has already been erected. Only the construction of the church and clinic remains, for which this year's **Mission Co-Op** Appeal at St. Paul the Apostle aim to contribute. On behalf of Father Maciej Fleszar and his parishioners, half of whom are young adults and children, I invite you to support the construction of this living monument to the Polish Pope, who also saw the future of the Church and the world in Africa. GOSPEL MEDITATION



When I was twenty-two years of age in August of 2000, I experienced World Youth Day in Rome. As for many of my generation, the event was life-changing for me. Surrounded by joyful, hope-filled young people from seemingly every nation and tongue, we were gathered around the Pope, sharing a common Faith and love. The Pope spoke to us of our shared family bond in the Church and invited us to give our lives in service to others. Now twenty-four years later, my life as a priest, like that of so many others from those special days, continues on that same path of love and unity — despite my many weaknesses. What makes that continuation possible?

This week's feast gives the answer: the Holy Spirit. The gift of God — His very life — the third person of the Trinity, is the Spirit who animates the entire Church and each member of it. He makes us one-in-love in a way that utterly exceeds human capacity. For example, he makes the apostles speak with tongues of fire, and everyone hears them in his own native tongue. The Holy Spirit is the means by which

Jesus establishes a new family, one that crosses all possible boundaries of time, space, and culture. The Holy Spirit never tires in enthusing us for mission.

Aren't we longing to experience the Holy Spirit in a fresh way? Today we celebrate this untiring flame, once ignited on earth and burning still. So, we humbly cry out: Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and enkindle in us the fire of your love!

READING I

ACTS 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together.

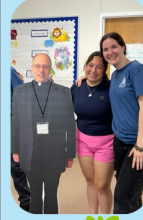

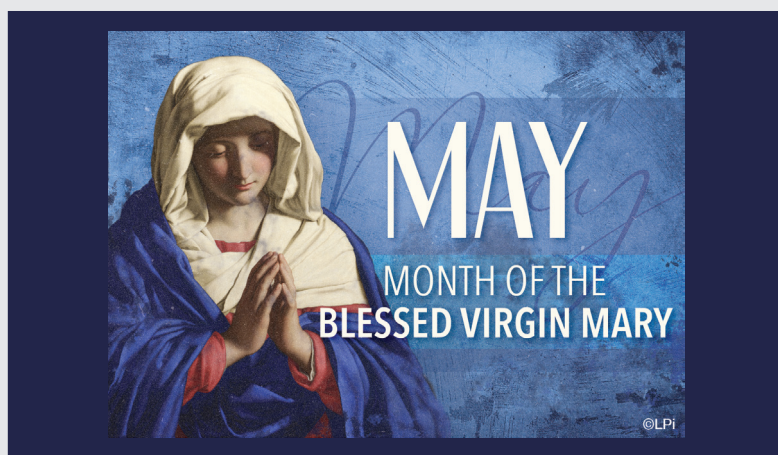
NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE in Chicago

June 26 – June 30, 2024

The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year, grassroots initiative of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to assist Catholics in coming to a fuller understanding and appreciation of the meaning of the Eucharist in the life of the Church. The aim is to proclaim that the celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life, to assist Catholics to encounter the Risen Lord in the Eucharist, and to deepen their discipleship in sharing His work of redeeming the world, won on the cross.

The Revival will culminate in a pilgrimage across the country to Indianapolis for the Eucharistic Congress in July 2024. The Archdiocese of Chicago, on the Marian Route of the pilgrimage, will host pilgrims and has organized special events and Eucharistic celebrations in archdiocesan parishes and locations from June 26 to 30, 2024.

PCM BIO- BARBARA WAGNER



Barbara grew up in New York with good immigrant parents, but devoid of any exposure to church or God. In college, she and her brother had a radical conversion to the Christian faith, and trying to evangelize her parents, almost

got kicked out of the house. Later, those same parents came to a serious choice to follow Jesus. Moving to Gurnee in 1998, she and her husband, Rolf, started reading early church history and, as a result, entered the Catholic Church at St Paul's in 2000. Having a love for Scripture, Barbara enrolled in 4 years to study OT/NT at St Xavier University.

In 2002, she started teaching Bible Studies at St Paul. You can still join us and do not need to have any previous knowledge of the Bible.

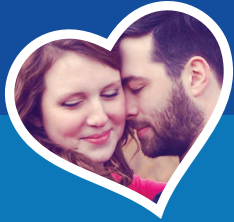
