SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT- MY BRAVE FRIEND, THOMAS

This week after Easter, I'm grateful that my Lent To-Do List has been recycled. It was filled with tasks which I gratefully checked off as each one was completed. Without that list, I likely would have forgotten half of what I needed to do. In the end, though I managed to do all those things, I also managed to distract myself from my annual trek through Lent with Jesus.

Lent is one of the opportunities I embrace to get up close and personal with our friend from Nazareth. Reflecting upon Jesus' life helps me to put my own life in this world into perspective. This year, events beyond my control disrupted my efforts even before they began. The assault on Ukraine came two weeks before Ash Wednesday. I decided then to do all I could to return peace to that nation. Though prayer seemed my most viable tool, I also helped with relief efforts. Still, as the assault continued, I felt helpless much of the time. Sadly, this seemed to be the case with much of the strife around me. In the process, I realized that this misery had caused me to lose sight of Jesus' tribulation as I plodded along toward Easter.

I admit that I was a bit discouraged when I sat to begin this writing. Fortunately, the gospel for this Second Sunday of Easter helped me to realize that I'm not alone in my sense of helplessness. Though Thomas and the others had Jesus in their midst, they often lost their perspective when it came to dealing with the troubles of this world. It was before returning to Jerusalem for what would be Jesus' last visit there that Jesus received news that his friend Lazarus was near death. For reasons unknown to the rest, Jesus delayed going to Lazarus for a few days. This likely gave the disciples some relief because the people had recently tried to stone Jesus in that very place. When Jesus eventually decided to go to Lazarus, the disciples expressed their fear. It was Thomas who spoke up and told the others, "Let us also go and die with him." Thomas said this though he had no idea of what was in store. I share this because Thomas' devotion to Jesus, and Jesus' devotion to Thomas, is apparent in today's gospel as well.

Today's gospel (John 20:19-31) also chronicles Thomas' bravery. Though Thomas had missed Jesus' first visit after he rose from the dead, John doesn't explain Thomas' absence. I wonder. Could Thomas

have been the only one brave enough to ignore the disciples' fear of the authorities? Did Thomas need to separate fact from rumor for himself regarding the responses of the people to Jesus' death? Did Thomas leave their hideout to see the full aftermath of Jesus' death firsthand? Perhaps Thomas wanted to experience the loss of his friend without the distraction of the others who mourned in fear. John's is the only gospel which reports Thomas' absence and doubt regarding Jesus' first visit after he rose. Perhaps the other gospel writers saw what I see in Thomas.



As for me, I see Thomas as a man of thought and action. Jesus' next visit indicated that Jesus wanted Thomas at his side. Scores of people would never have heard the name of Jesus if Thomas hadn't spoken it to them. Many others would never have understood forgiveness, compassion, and mercy if Thomas hadn't shared his experience of those things with them. Thomas touched those with skeptical hearts because he once walked in their shoes. When Jesus returned to the disciples that second time, Thomas stood among them. When Jesus invited him to come closer, Thomas responded in a strong voice: "My Lord and my God!" Whatever Thomas had questioned before this encounter became certainty the moment Thomas saw Jesus that day.

I have great affection for the Apostle Thomas because I walked in his shoes throughout Lent 2022, and I walk in those shoes often. I understand Thomas' need to leave that upper room and to sort things out for himself because I often need to do the same. I also understand Thomas' elation when Jesus reached out to him. Though my angst remained with me when the Good Friday liturgy began, it disappeared during the reading of The Passion. It was then that I walked beside Jesus through it all. Finally, I understood that I'd walk through Easter with him as well. Finally, I looked beyond those distractions and embraced my dear sweet Lord who had been with me all the while. Finally, I found Thomas' wisdom and courage as I whispered with deep gratitude, "My Lord and my God."

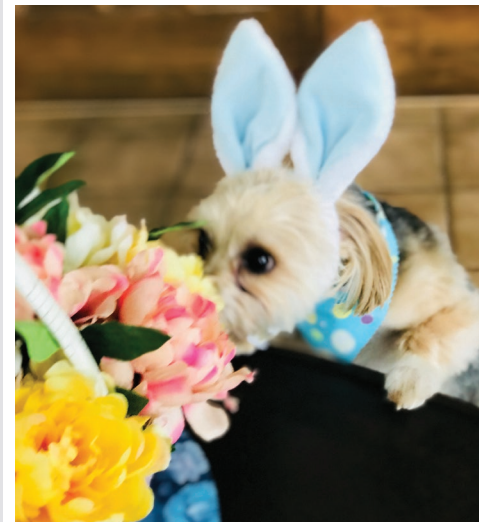


