## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT- LIVE WITH HOPE AND GRATITUDE!

When I checked the date of this writing, I smiled because the eightieth anniversary of my parents' wedding day approaches. My mom and dad will acknowledge this milestone in a place far better than this troubled world. I'll celebrate here with old photos and poignant memories. Though I'll be tempted to long for the simpler times my parents seemed to enjoy, I won't. Life on this earth was no easier for them than it is for us these days. Though the details of our circumstances differ, similar pain has punctuated human history since our beginning.

One treasure which my mom left us was an album filled the bridal shower and wedding cards she and my dad had received. My mom treasured them because each one got to the heart of the things which are truly important as we journey through this life. Most of the cards my parents received measured no more than three inches or four inches in height and width. Yet, in spite of their diminutive size, they carried grand wishes. Personal notes added to manufactured verses spoke eloquently of each sender's love for my future parents. For me, each signature elicited the image of a family member or friend from long ago.

When I thumbed through that album's yellowed pages one last time, one letter-sized paper stood out. I wondered who'd sent this greeting. As I read, I found it to be the most touching message of all. It was written by the president of the company for which my mom worked. That extremely wise man shared: *"Dear Rita: I am happy to learn that you are to be married on Saturday and want to extend my best wishes to you and your husband. May your wedded life be full of joy and happiness. Do not let the present gloomy world conditions put a damper on your hopes and ambitions. Marriage is a wonderful venture in life and I know it is going to mean much happiness to you both in the years to come. With kindest regards, I remain... W. R. Barker"*

When my parents married in 1942, World War II raged. Times were tough. Many family members and friends were serving in the military. Damage done by a bout with rheumatic fever kept my dad from joining them. My mom had been working for years by then. This began during high school because her family needed the added income. My mom's only regret was her inability to attend college. Tuition was simply unaffordable. Fortunately, meeting my dad dulled the sting of that unrealized dream because a new dream took shape in their relationship. My parents' wedding day began the seventeen amazing years they shared until my dad passed away.

It seems that Mr. Barker knew the potential for joy which my parents realized. His letter summed up everything any of us can hope for in this life: A measure of happiness, the love of others, encouragement despite troubling times, and friends who stand at our sides. My mom must have appreciated Mr. Barker's sentiments because she'd saved his letter. My mom's grateful approach to her circumstances over the years that followed convince me that she also took Mr. Barker's sentiments to heart. Our hopes, our ambitions and our love really do make all the difference regardless of the circumstances around us.



Mr. Barker's words come to mind as I write because they echo the love and hope for us which Jesus exhibited. Today's gospel (Luke 7:11-19) does the same. That day, Jesus came upon ten lepers. When they saw him, the suffering men cried out, "Jesus! Master! Have pity on us!" Jesus knew their pain as only he could and, without hesitation, he cured them. When Jesus sent them off to show themselves to the priests of the temple, one leper realized he'd been healed. While the others went on to have themselves declared cured, that man raced back to thank Jesus. Though the others realized what had occurred, only he returned. That man had recognized the more significant blessing. He'd encountered the Lord! His body was made whole, *and* his spirit had been revived by God's all-encompassing love! That grateful one-time leper realized that he *would* flourish despite the world's gloomy conditions because he was loved. God's love ensured him that nothing would ever again put a damper on his hope. Indeed, that man returned to say, "Thank you, Lord!" for very good reasons!

As I consider the cards which filled my mom's album, I realize she kept them for good reason as well. They provided a constant reminder of the love which surrounded her and my dad as they began their life together. Just as the leper's healing reminded him of God's healing love, my mom's album kept her ever aware of God and all the loved ones who walked this life's journey with her. I think Mr. Barker offered an excellent description of how we might respond to God's love in our lives: *We must never allow gloomy world conditions to put a damper on our hopes and ambitions. Life is a wonderful venture which will mean much happiness to us in the days to come.* Yes, Mr. Barker, both on this earth and in heaven above!

## Ministry Sunday- Human Concerns

Are you looking for ways to experience God? Members of the Human Concerns Commission ministries invite you to learn about their works at Ministry Sunday the weekend of **October 22nd-23rd** in the gathering space, before and after all the masses. We see Christ in our neighbors in need and, when we see Christ, we experience God.

**Meals & Services:** We provide home-cooked meals, rides, and general errands such as prescriptions and groceries for families in need due to illness, death in the family, or other difficult times.

**Food Pantry:** We support Holy Family and St. Anastasia Food Pantries by collecting money/food, clothing/seasonal items, recruiting volunteers, and promoting awareness of hunger related issues.

**Funeral Hospitality:** After funeral Masses, we offer a luncheon by request by the family to the family members and friends who have gathered at St. Paul to celebrate the life of their loved one.

**Grief Journey Support:** There is no way to prevent grief; there is no way to cure it; there is no way around it. The only way to a place of peace is to go through the pain of separation from a loved one in a healthy, constructive manner toward healing.

**Knit/Purl/Pray:** Our members provide comfort, solace and support by using their talents for knitting and crocheting along with their prayers and loving intentions to create handmade knit and crochet prayer shawls, baby blankets, and other needed items.

**St. Vincent de Paul Society:** Inspired by Gospel values, the ministry leads women and men together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder, Blessed Frédéric Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

**Respect for Life:** As every human person is created in God's image and likeness, the Respect Life ministry carries out the Church's mission to support the most vulnerable members of the human family. Through prayer, fundraising and public witness, we share the Gospel of Life and stand against abortion and all other violations of the dignity of the human person.

**Ministers of Care:** We bring the Eucharist to those who can no longer attend Mass or are temporarily home bound. We also visit area nursing homes weekly to offer Holy Communion services to Catholic residents.

**Catholic Charities Parish Outreach:** Saint Paul supports two large Lake County programs: the Mother's Day appeal which supports many Catholic Charities programs and the Christmas Gift Campaign which provides gifts to families and individuals referred to Catholic Charities.

**Natural Family Planning:** Our classes provide fertility awareness to enable the married couple to achieve or prevent a pregnancy in a way that respects their individual dignity, is natural, and morally acceptable. Couples deepen their relationship in the process.

**Divorce Support:** We provide a framework of physical and spiritual support for individuals who are contemplating divorce or have recently gone through a separation or divorce. When necessary, feelings of separation from the Church are also addressed.

**Annulment:** "The salvation of souls must always be the highest law in the church..." Canon 1752  
This ministry is offered to anyone who is divorced or already remarried who would like to undertake the declaration of nullity process as well as some spiritual closure.

**Simbang Gabi Charities:** We are more than just the celebration of a beloved Filipino tradition heralding the joy of the upcoming birth of Jesus. We give hope to our brothers and sisters in need in the Philippines from poor/orphaned children to the abandoned elderly.

**Knights of Columbus:** Divine Mercy Council 11112 are brothers united in faith to serve our Church, Charities, and Community. We are a fraternal Catholic men's organization dedicated to preserving our faith, religious beliefs and freedom, supporting and performing charitable works and deeds.

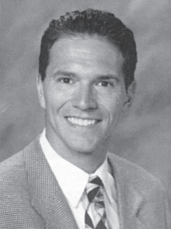

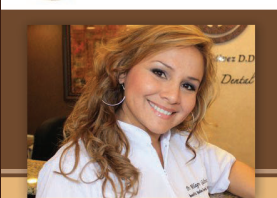
